The 50 cultural heritage sites in 36 countries named to this prestigious list in 2016 are emblematic of preservation issues prevalent around the globe.

The World Monuments Fund (WMF) brings the fragility of these sites and the dangers they face to international attention and identifies opportunities for local communities to work together to ensure each site's future.

WMF President Emerita Bonnie Burnham said, "The 2016 Watch includes many extraordinary places that deserve to be celebrated because they represent high moments of human culture. Worldwide concern would strengthen our ability to save them. We hope our endorsement will advance their goals to save each of these cherished places." We are using this opportunity to refine our master preservation plan and build a long-term funding plan.



Old altar, new lights

By mid-year, the altar at the Mission will be awash with warm, direct lighting that enhances the beauty and detail of the interior, especially the retablo mayor.


Lighting engineer Chris Monrad of Monrad Engineering not only developed an up-to-date lighting plan for the interior, but also donated several LED bulbs providing an instant improvement to the lighting within the interior. Additional LED lighting to illuminate the altar will be purchased thanks to a generous grant from TRICO Electric Coop. The lighting plan, undertaken at the direction of Patronato's construction committee, revealed the need to replace conventional bulbs that produced poor quality lighting and generated a great deal of heat.

Next time you visit the Mission, prepare to be amazed by the impact of the new low energy, more efficient, and definitely more beautiful LED lighting.

WMF's decision to add Mission San Xavier to the list stems from Patronato's ongoing efforts to preserve the architectural, artistic, and cultural significance of this site. The Mission remains an important parish church for people living in the surrounding area.

"The Patronato board is using this vote of confidence from the World Monuments Fund to expand our vision for long-term preservation. WMF recognition is an opportunity for us to attract funding outside of Southern Arizona, and we are looking at statewide, national and global opportunities," said Miles.
